Business Closure Requirements

This fact sheet summarizes the regulatory requirements for closure of a business handling hazardous materials and/or generating hazardous waste. It does not include the additional closure requirements for generators treating onsite hazardous waste under a tiered permit authorization. Business Closure

Businesses are obligated to comply with specific regulatory requirements upon closure of their facilities. If an individual owner or a company moves, goes out of business or sells their facility; then, they must comply with the following closure requirements:

- Decontaminate and/or remove all contaminated equipment, structures and soil. All hazardous wastes generated during closure activities must be properly disposed of and the associated manifests made available for inspection.
- Minimize/control/eliminate the escape of hazardous waste or hazardous waste constituents into the environment.
- When required, submit a closure plan demonstrating how the hazardous materials will be transported, disposed of, or reused in a manner that eliminates the need for further maintenance and any threat to public health and safety.

In addition to the above regulatory closure requirements, businesses should:

- Contact this Department's Financial Management Division at (323) 881-2444 to initiate the permit
 inactivation process and pay any outstanding fees. Businesses that close without paying their permit fees
 may be subject to potential penalties and/or enforcement action.

Site Cleanup

Corrective action and/or site cleanup is required when there has been a release, or suspected release, of hazardous materials, hazardous waste and/or hazardous waste constituents into the environment. Businesses are responsible for remediation activities and should contact the Site Mitigation Unit (SMU) at (323) 890-4106 for further information.
