

Current Situation:	Firefighters worked hard through the day in rugged terrain throughout the burn area to increase containment lines and address hot spots. Tactical patrols will remain in place tonight to monitor the area for smoldering debris. Tonight will bring gusty winds that are expected to increase Friday morning Crews will remain vigilant throughout the evening to strengthen and improve containment lines. We ask that public to please drive cautiously and yield to emergency personnel transiting the area. The cause of the Saddle Ridge Fire remains under active investigation.
