CURRENT SITUATION	
Current Situation:	Tonight, firefighters will take advantage of lower wind speeds, increasing humidity and decreased temperatures. This weather will greatly enhance firefighters' ability to mop up remaining hot spots. Tactical patrols will continue throughout the evening to ensure containment lines remain static and smoldering debris remains isolated from unburned vegetation.
Repopulation Efforts:	All evacuations related to the Saddle Ridge Fire have been lifted. We appreciate the community for their prompt compliance with evacuation orders. As residents return home, we ask that they drive slowly and remain cautious of emergency personnel operating in the area.
