CURRENT SITUATION				
Current Situation:	The National Weather Service predicts the Santa Ana wind conditions in the operational area will continue until approximately 6:00 PM tonight. Firefighters will be operating with sustained winds of 10-15 mph with gusts up to 40 mph. Last night there was an aggressive air attack supporting crews on the ground as they continued to shore up and reinforce containment lines. Aircraft will continue to work this incident in a coordinated effort to ensure the fire does not breech containment lines. A repopulation effort is underway in areas deemed safe by damage assessment teams. It is imperative that residents maintain situational awareness and use extreme caution as they move into the area.			

Repopulation Efforts:	We understand community members being allowed back into their homes and businesses is a priority. Unified Commanders are working to allow for safe repopulation as soon as possible. At this time we are able to safely repopulate the following areas; The areas west of Mason Avenue and southwest of Corbin Avenue. In addition, there are smaller areas to the east which are also being repopulated, which can be found on the attached link: https://www.lafd.org/news/saddle-ridge-brush-fire Please refer to this color coded map, which shows the repopulated areas in green and the active mandatory evacuation areas in red. Law enforcement officers will remain in the affected areas as a means of roving security and to address any questions residents may have. Extra patrol units will remain for saturation patrol, looter suppression and additional fire watch in areas still under mandatory evacuation.
